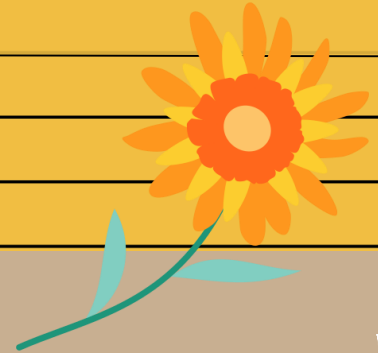
WHAT: **Follow-up** of roundtable started in August 2023 in Uganda, welcoming **new participants** in the network

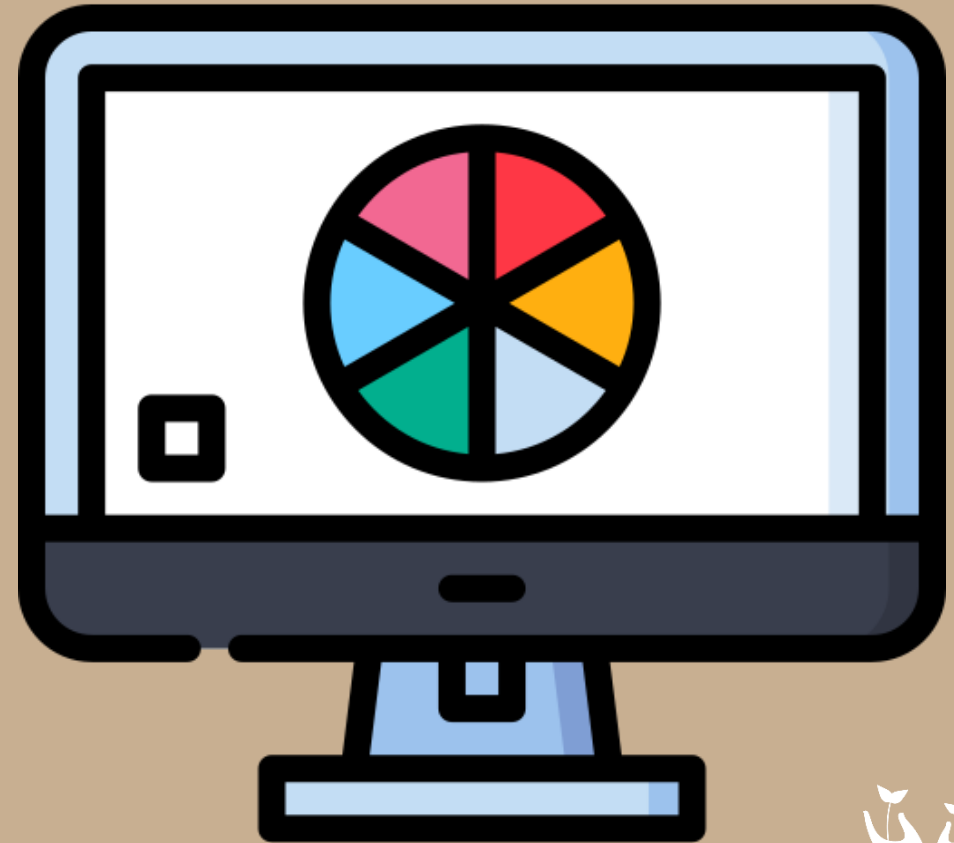

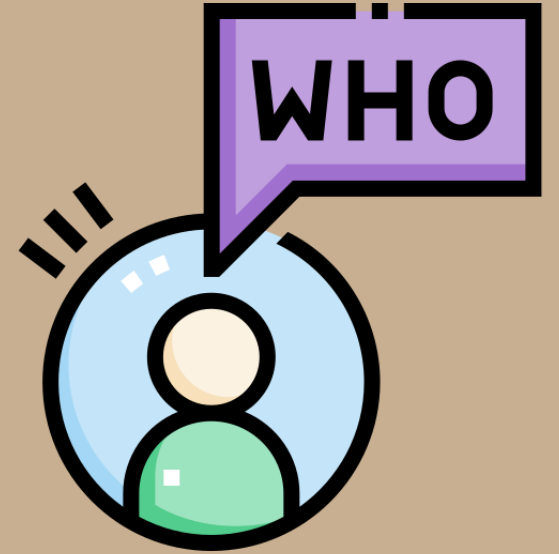

Challenges?

Plenum Sharing Session

Challenges?

Plenum Sharing Session

- duplication of work
- getting funders/donors
- capacity building (implementation process/decision-making process/ training participants)
- integration (sufficient quantifiable data/sophisticated software)
- climate change (extreme weather while pursuing regenerative solutions)
- timing

Challenges?

Plenum Sharing Session

- lack of meaningful beneficiaries
- dependency on donor funding
(attractiveness for private investment?)
- poverty (grassroot-level actors, (seed usage))
- consistency (of pursuing regenerative solutions)
- globalization (competition)
- sustainability (are we able to sustain?)
