# Collective Key Terms to Assess Early Donor Involvement for Regenerative Solutions in Refugee Camps

## 1. Strategic Alignment

- What to Look For: Donor values aligned with regenerative, community-led, and long-term approaches.
- How to Assess:
  - Review donor mission statements and past projects.
  - Analyze alignment with your theory of change.
  - Invite donors to co-visioning sessions early on.

## 2. Early Communication & Co-Creation

- What to Look For: Donors are involved in ideation, not just funding decisions, and accept local knowledge throughout.
- How to Assess:
  - Track early engagement touchpoints (emails, calls, workshops, social media, events).
  - Note whether donor feedback is integrated into program design.
  - Invite donors to join learning and discovery phases.
  - Assess their reaction towards local ideas.

## 3. Flexibility of Funding

- What to Look For: Adaptive, trust-based funding models that support iteration and learning.
- How to Assess:
  - Charting the theory of change and impact of the project (e.g. with IOOI).
  - Check grant conditions: Are they outcome-focused or rigid?
  - Look for language like "pilot funding," "flexible budgets," or "adaptive cycles."
  - Ask how changes or pivots are handled mid-grant.

#### 4. Support for Long-Term Outcomes

- What to Look For: Willingness to fund beyond short-term KPIs and support systems change.
- How to Assess:
  - Review grant length (multi-year vs. short-term).
  - Discuss expectations around impact timelines.
  - $\circ$  Explore phase-based commitments (e.g. pilot  $\rightarrow$  scale).

#### **5. Investment in Local Capacity**

- What to Look For: Support for refugee-led initiatives and host community capacity building.
- How to Assess:
  - Budget allocations to grassroots, refugee-led organizations and their host communities.
  - Funding for leadership development and training.
  - Donor willingness to engage with local voices directly.

#### 6. Monitoring & Learning Support

- What to Look For: Donors who support participatory M&E and shared learning.
- How to Assess:
  - Inclusion of community-led indicators in M&E plans.
  - Openness to learning reviews and adaptation.
  - Budget for feedback loops, reflection, and iteration.
